Why should we remember?



World War I, also known as the First World War, was a global war centred in Europe that began on 28th July 1914 and lasted until 11th November 1918. Our topic this term is based on remembering events from WW1. We will look back and remember it because of the heavy losses on both sides of the war as well as the advances in warfare. We will remember it with pride but also remember the lost lives and soldiers who died saving their country.

We will be looking at: the lives of soldiers in the Great War; significant individuals in WWI; the reasons WWI occurred; poetry written from the frontline; the impact at home; the Christmas truce; symbolism of the poppy, map reading skills and many other aspects of WWI.

Our key texts this term are, 'War Horse' by Michael Morpurgo, 'Where the poppies now grow' by Hilary Robinson and 'Archie's War' by Marcia Williams. For this term we will mainly cover: Descriptive writing, Persuasive writing, Non Chronological reports, Newspaper articles, Poetry and letters.

This terms Geography will be closely linked to the topic, mainly covering: Mapping skills, using atlases and globes to locate countries. The children will also build their knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world.

During our maths lessons this term we will be focusing on developing children's knowledge of written calculation. We will look at developing pupils' strategies of using and applying number as well as allowing children to gain further experience of practising solving problems in a methodical and systematic way
